About University Housing

- During the academic year, we house just under 9,000 undergraduate students in 22 residence halls
- Primarily first-year students with approximately 1,000 returning students
- Residence halls and dining locations in both neighborhoods of campus
- Staff support House Fellows to assist with transition to campus, questions, roommate conflicts, etc.
- Facilities support for maintenance related issues in your room or hall
- Easy access to libraries, study spaces, and dining halls
- No additional costs for internet, electric, or water

Dates

- Specific pre-set Summer Term dates
- Early arrival is not permitted must move in on or after your assigned move-in date
- Summer Term residents not living in housing for Academic Year 2023-24 must be fully moved out by noon on August 12, 2023 if signed up for the 8-Week session

Location

- Summer Term Housing will be located in Kronshage and Adams Hall
- Some single room availability on a first-come, first-serve basis
- Singles are very limited and in high demand
- Access to shared kitchen, laundry, bathrooms, and communal spaces

- Mostly single rooms limited spaces as the entire building is not used

Cost


- Costs are dependent on the room type you are assigned to and which session you are signed up for
- When offered a contract, you will be told if you are being offered a single or a double room
- If you requested a single but were offered a double, you will automatically be placed on a waiting list for a single. It is unlikely that you will be offered a single if on the waiting list


Environment

- Primarily undergraduate students aged 18-20
- Most summer residents will have a roommate
- Significant mix of domestic and international students
- Shared bathrooms among the floor
- Access to kitchen and laundry facilities
- Communal lounges for studying and programming
- House Fellow staff available within the hall

- You cannot apply unless you have been admitted to the university
- Once your net ID and password have been set up, you will be able to log in with those credentials in My UW Housing (go.wisc.edu/my-housing)
 - **Important: Do not create an account in My UW Housing. This will create a duplicate
 account and prevent you from signing in. Your information will pull over from campus
 data and you should not log in until you have your Net ID and password
- Once you log in, you should see a summer application you can click on
- If your My UW Housing portal main screen is empty and there is no summer application to select, please email us at AssignMe@housing.wisc.edu for assistance




Log Out



- Once you are in your application, navigate the pages by answering questions about accommodation needs, room requests, roommate requests, sessions, etc.
- Be sure to read all pages carefully, especially when selecting your requested session. This will determine your summer charges.
- After you have answered all questions and have selected your desired dates, you will be brought to a landing page.
- Please allow a few business days for us to review and respond to your application. Be sure to check your email as any clarification needed will be communicate via email.

*Summer to fall transition charges include August 12-August 27 when academic year charges begin. Early arrival charges are not assessed for students who are signed up for summer to fall transition.





Waiting for Summer Contract

Thank you for submitting your Summer Term Housing application. Applications are processed in the order they are received. Please check your email for further information regarding your summer housing application. Once an application is submitted, you can anticipate communication from University Housing via email with 48 business hours of when you submitted your application. Please remember that submission of an application is not a guarantee of housing for the summer term.


If you submitted an application as a University Housing employee, you will not receive a contract offer until your employment is verified by University Housing Human Resources.

Contracting Process

- If you are offered a contract after completing an application, you will receive an email letting you know if it is for a single or double room.
- Most students will have one week to complete the contract.
- The contract becomes **legally binding** once the contract is signed and the advance payment is made. We do not release students from the contract to live off campus. Take the time to fully read the contract.
- Contracting occurs in your Summer 2023 application in My UW Housing.
 There will be additional disclosure questions.
- Once complete, assignment and move-in information is emailed one week prior to move-in.


Housing Contract

Take time to review the contract carefully. By signing the contract and submitting an advance payment, you are entering into a legally binding financial agreement. Entering your name and Campus ID number below will serve as your electronic signature.

Note: We do not release students from contractual and financial obligations to live off-campus once our contract is signed.

Enrollment or Employee Requirement

In order to be eligible to live in summer housing, you must be enrolled in at least 1 credit during the summer, or you must be a verified University Housing Summer Employee. If you withdraw from summer courses, or if you leave your employment and are not enrolled in summer courses, your Summer 2023 contract will be cancelled and your advance payment will be forfeit.
